



CONTEXT


The 2nd World Youth Assembly for Road Safety took place in Stockholm, Sweden on February 18, 2020. The Assembly brought together 160+ youth leaders from 74 countries who are taking concrete actions for reaching the Sustainable Development Goals through a lens of road safety. Through intergenerational talks, a bridge was built between current decision-makers and youth leaders. With the adoption of the **Global Youth Statement for Road Safety** there is a clear advocacy instrument calling for urgent action and commitments from all stakeholders.

The Youth Leaders at the Assembly asked for a long-term follow-up mechanism to coordinate and strategize the global youth movement for road safety.

ABOUT THE COALITION*

The Global Youth Coalition for Road Safety (Youth Coalition) unite individual youth and organizations in an informal member-based structure guided by key principles, with a focus on meaningful youth participation and safe mobility.

Through the Youth Coalition, young changemakers will receive access to resources, capacity development opportunities and offered strategic partnerships to implement evidence-based local actions and innovative strategies for (global) advocacy. The actions and advocacy work will be focused on solving the most pressing issues for this young generation, such as safe & sustainable mobility, climate change, gender equality, inequalities, health, education and other Sustainable Development Goals that have a direct linkage with road safety.



The ultimate outcome of the Youth Coalition is to energize and strategize the global youth movement for road safety. This movement has committed youth leaders from around the world advocating for the demands written in the Global Youth Statement for Road Safety and contributing to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, especially in the target of halving road traffic deaths by 2030.






PARTNERS

The Youth Coalition is welcoming various organizations to become partners in the 'support structure'. Especially those (inter)national governmental organizations, institutions, companies and academia that believes in meaningful youth participation and/or have actual projects with a focus on meaningful youth participation and empowerment.

There are 3 different types of partners within the Global Youth Coalition for Road Safety:



The **PROGRAMME PARTNERS** are organizations with a longstanding commitment towards the Global Youth Coalition and its overall activities, including global advocacy, local actions and its support structure. This is an exclusive type of partner that provides the entire strategy with a long-term investment.

The **PROJECT PARINERS** are organizations partnering and funding the Global Youth Coalition for a specific project or activity at a certain time and/or place, aligned with both parties' interests. E.g. a regional workshop, an advocacy campaign or a youth-led local project in a specific country.

The **COLLABORATING PARTNERS** are international organizations with technical expertise on topics related to youth and road safety such as climate change, health, gender equality, sustainable cities, poverty and other development fields with a clear linkage to road safety. Their participation will ensure that young leaders have holistic support and avenues to implement their safe & sustainable mobility projects, through the lens of different fields of work that are complementary.





ALL PARTNERS are expected to assist in promoting the Youth Coalition, help the recruitment of talented youth leaders and provide support towards its activities.
